ENVIRONMENT AND THE ECONOMY (E&E) – June 26-July 1, 2023

University of California - Santa Barbara, CA

Registration/Check-In

Monday, June 26th between 2:00 - 4:00 PM at the front desk of De Anza Resource Center (within Manzanita Village Residence Hall), located at 6130 Ocean Rd, Isla Vista, CA 93117. Room keys and meal cards will be distributed during this time. FTE staff will be on site from 2:00 PM on Monday, June 26th through 11:00 AM on Saturday, July 1st.

Parking

Parking permits will not be available for the duration of the program. Parking on campus can be purchased via the Park Mobile app. Parking garage 22 is the closest to the residence hall. Permits are required at all times and are \$8 per day.

Please note - if students drive themselves to the program, they will not be permitted to use their car during the program.

Housing

Students will stay in Manzanita Village Residence Hall. Students will be housed two per room and separated by gender. Bathrooms are gender specific and communal. FTE Program Coordinators reside in adjacent rooms to the students and are available 24 hours a day. Upon departure from the program, the dormitory room should look as it did when the student arrived.

Meals

Students will eat their meals together throughout the program in Carrillo Dining Commons located within Manzanita Village, except for Thursday night's dinner – this meal is at the participant's own expense. Any extra snacks, outside of the program meals, will be at the participant's expense.

Meeting Room

The large meeting room for the week in the mornings will be the Loma Pelona Conference Center: 1108.

Recreation Options

The Manzanita Village Residence Hall has sand volleyball courts, a rec room and pool available to use during rec time.

Off Site Excursion

On Thursday afternoon, the group will leave for an off-site field trip to the UCSB Marine Science Institute. The trip will include lunch and last from 11am-4pm. Following the excursion will be a barbeque on Goleta Beach. Dinner will be provided.

Expenses

Program expenses, including room and board, will be paid for by the Foundation for Teaching Economics (FTE). Participant expenses include travel to and from the program site, and any additional incidental expenses. It will be your responsibility to have enough cash to handle incidentals. Neither FTE staff nor the University of California will cash any checks. Please do not bring a large amount of cash to the program.

All keys and access/meal cards must be returned at the end of the program. FTE will not cover lost or unreturned keys. Participants will be charged \$75-\$125 for lost or unreturned room keys.

Personal Supplies

Bring items that will make your stay comfortable, including personal hygiene items and shower slippers/flip flops. All bedding, linens and towels are provided by Conference Services. All classroom supplies will be provided by FTE. Neither UCSB nor FTE can assume responsibility for your personal belongings – Laptop computers are not required and bringing them is at the discretion of the participant.

Dress Code

Classroom-appropriate, casual, comfortable clothing is the rule on campus. Shorts, t-shirts and jeans are acceptable. Shoes, sandals or flip flops must be worn to the classroom and dining room. Bring appropriate clothing and closed-toed shoes (that can get dirty) for the outdoor leadership activities and the optional recreation activities such as swimming, basketball and volleyball. Include a sweatshirt or warm jacket as it can be cold in the evenings.

Program Overview

The Environment & the Economy program represents a unique experience in economics education that brings together two groups: rising high school juniors and seniors selected for their leadership potential who want to study economics and have expressed an interest in environmental justice, and high school economics teachers who wish to enhance their teaching skills in the subject. The E&E one-week program encompasses 50 hours of instruction plus small group sessions and workshops. The combination of classroom instruction, question and answer sessions, small group discussion, and workshops presents information in a rich and varied format, encouraging active student and teacher participation. Economics professors selected nationwide for their expertise and teaching effectiveness lead classes using case studies to illustrate environmental issues, economics principles and leadership concepts.

E&E is designed to create a diverse learning environment for the students while teachers can observe, in action, the types of teaching methods advocated by FTE. In addition to study sessions, the program also includes leadership components which emphasize self-exploration through teamwork exercises. These activities provide a physical outlet and an enjoyable diversion from the economics lessons.

Student Goals:

1. Become articulate on the basic forces moving and coordinating the economy.
2. Learn about the economic aspects of select current national and international environmental issues.
3. Gain leadership skills.
4. Foster a commitment to continued learning about the environment, economics, and leadership.

A final schedule will be distributed at program registration on Monday. The start and finish times of the program will not change whatsoever.

UCSB ePermits are required for parking at all times

Permit dispensers throughout campus sell short-term permits at all times. The Parking Sales Office in Building 381 off Stadium Road sells permits during business hours. Payment by credit card and cash is accepted.

A short-term permit entitles you to Visitor parking status. Please ensure that you park in a space or lot allowed by your permit type as parking violations are subject to citation. Do not park in spaces marked "RESTRICTED at All Times", "Reserved" or "Restricted" without an appropriate permit.

What do the lot colors mean?

- Yellow** Student parking allowed at all times. Visitor parking is restricted Friday-Saturday from Midnight to 5:00 am
- Green** No visitor or student parking Monday to Friday between 7:30 AM and 5:00 PM. Visitor and student parking allowed at other times. Individual spaces within lots may have restrictions.
- Blue/White Stripes** No staff, visitor or student parking in 15 Parking Monday to Friday between 7:30 AM and 5:00 PM.
- Navy** No visitor or student parking (except Disabled) at any time.
- Orange** Residence Hall student parking at all times. Each location requires its own H permit.

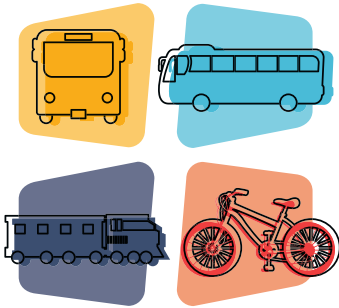

From there your travel options are to fly to Santa Barbara, rent a car and drive to Santa Barbara, or travel to Santa Barbara via the Santa Barbara Airbus.
